Middle East and Africa Lighting Fixtures Market Revenues

"Middle East and Africa lighting fixture market is expected to grow in the upcoming years owing to the various upcoming projects such as Al Siniyah Island Project UAE, Residence Eight Project Egypt along with government initiatives such as Saudi Arabia's Made in Saudi Program, Qatar National Vision 2030."

- The Middle East and Africa Lighting fixtures market grew at a decent rate in the 2018-2019 owing to increasing demand from the residential buildings, hotels and offices. Saudi Arabia's office stock stood at 4.3 million sqm of gross leasable area (GLA) in the last quarter of 2019 and expected 1.66 million sqm GLA to be delivered by 2023. Moreover, 242 PPP projects worth \$223 billion are under development in the Middle East and North Africa region along with upcoming 15,152 rooms in Egypt and 15,507 rooms in Qatar.
- In 2020, due to the outbreak of COVID-19, major construction projects came to a halt, which negatively impacted the demand for Lighting fixtures. Most of the projects were delayed on account of lockdown imposition, thus the major companies were facing short-term operational issues due to supply chain constraints and lack of site access. However, the resumption of the construction activities are anticipated to upsurge the demand for Lighting fixtures in forecast years.
- Growing industrial sector due to increase in the investment in the manufacturing sector in the Middle East and African countries is going to drive the Lighting fixtures market in the coming years. Additionally, the government initiatives such as, Saudi Arabia's Made in Saudi Program, Government of Rwanda, partnership with the African Development Bank's Fund for African Private Sector Assistance worth \$5.5 million to boost the industrial capacity in the country, Qatar National Vision 2030 which aims to increase the value of production by 30% in 2025, UAE plans to increase industrial revenue to \$81 billion by 2030 would increase the demand for lighting fixtures.

Middle East and Africa Lighting Fixtures Market Revenue Share, By Countries

"Saudi Arabia held the largest revenue share in 2022 in Middle East on account of growing investment in the infrastructure sector. The government is expected to spend additional \$1.3 trillion along with annual investment worth \$38 billion till 2025. Similarly, South Africa held the largest share in the Africa market in 2022."

Residential sector has acquired the second largest revenue share on account of government plans such as Saudi Arabia Housing Vision 2030, Residence Eight Project Egypt."

Middle East Lighting Fixtures Market Drivers - Growing Number of Residential Units

"Residential sector is growing in the Middle East and Africa region owing to rising population and government initiatives such as Saudi Arabia Housing Vision 2030, Dubai 2040 Urban Master Plan as well as a joint initiative between the Saudi Arabia Ministry of Housing and the Real Estate Development Fund Shrakat program which aims to increase the percentage of Saudi home ownership to 70 percent by 2030."

Currently, the average household size in Middle East and North Africa is over 6.9 people as compared to the OECD average of 2.6 persons indicating the undersupply of homes which is propelling the demand of housing units in the region.

The growing population along with rising urbanization in Middle East and Africa remains a core contributor towards the increase in demand of new housing spaces. In 2021, Saudi Arabia witnessed growth in the number of new housing units by 29 percent, Turkey witnessed sale of 3,20,063 houses and apartments in Q1 of 2022 and Dubai had a total supply of 6,700 residential units in Q1 of 2022 with 31,000 more units are expected to be delivered from Q2 to Q4 which is boosting the growth of urban residential infrastructure across the region. The increasing number of residential buildings in Middle East and Africa is contributing towards fresh demand for Lighting which in return would create the demand fixtures in the upcoming years.

Middle East Lighting Fixtures Market Drivers – Growing Number of Commercial Buildings

"Office space requirement is rising sharply owing to resumption of business activities in the cities like Riyadh, Dubai, Istanbul post Covid 19 restrictions, coupled with growing number of start-ups in Africa. Growing commercial sector in the region is expected to generate demand for Lighting fixture in the forecast period"

Demand for office space in Dubai and Riyadh witnessed huge growth with office occupancy reaching 81% and 96% respectively amid a huge influx of foreign companies looking to expand or relocate in the country. Additionally, Turkey's Class A office stock is expected to reach 13,5 million sq m by 2023 indicating a strong base for commercial sector in the region. In 2022, the total amount of investment raised by start-ups in the Middle East and North Africa amounts to \$323.7 million across 66 deals fuelling the growth for commercial buildings. The growing investment in tech companies and offices would significantly augment the demand for Lighting fixture in Middle East and Africa in the coming years.



UAE Construction Sector Outlook

"The growth in UAE construction sector of around 4.2% in 2022 coupled with US\$23bn of infrastructure investment would result in an increase in number of upcoming construction projects and since, a major proportion of Lighting sales comes from infrastructure buildings this would propel the growth of Lighting fixtures in UAE during the forecast period"

Saudi Arabia Construction Sector Outlook

"Investment amounting to \$ 1.1 trillion in infrastructure and real estate projects along with efforts by the government such as Saudi Arabia's Vision 2030 to boost the construction is expected to propel the demand for Lighting fixtures".

- The construction sector in the country is anticipated to register substantial growth during the forecast period owing to with planned construction projects in the Kingdom being over 555,000 residential units, 275,000 hotel keys, over 4.3 million square meters of retail space, along with 6.1 million square meters of office space.
- The country is witnessing various giga projects in the region such as NEOM which is expected to house 9 million residents across 300,000 new homes, Diriyah Gate a \$20 billion would provide 20,000 homes and is expected to be completed by 2027, an international airport worth \$147 billion, 19,000 hospital beds with planned investment for \$13.8 billion, 80 new educational institutions constructed for \$82 billion. These upcoming infrastructural projects is expected to boost the demand for Lighting fixtures in the coming years.

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Turkey Infrastructural Investment Outlook

"Turkey would witness various upcoming infrastructural projects along with 320,063 house and apartments sale in Q2 2022 which is 21.7% higher than the houses sold within the same time period of previous year, offers growth prospects for Lighting fixture market."

- The introduction of smart cities concept in the country is the major driving force for the Lighting fixtures market. The infrastructure segment includes, development in commercial sector, rail, airports, etc. which have led to the development of office building, working space etc. which further expected to boost the demand for Lighting fixtures in the country.
- Turkey released an investment program to fund 3,091 projects in 2021, program totals \$18.5 billion and the largest number of projects (946) was in education, followed by 756 in other public (social and economic) projects.
- Also, total construction project pipeline in Turkey stands at \$508 billion and Turkey governments allows construction permits for new construction or remodeling of buildings for the use of residential sector, offices, warehouses etc. along with growing Turkey's startup ecosystem by 43% compared to the first quarter of 2021, would boost the construction of new offices, thereby the necessity for Lighting items, particularly in offices would remain an important aspect in developing commercial sector.
